

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ORDINANCE NO. 160876

Enacting a new Section 68.449, Code of Ordinances, entitled Sales tax (2019) to extend for 20 years the City's current 1% sales tax used for capital improvements and to codify dedication of 35% of the available annual sales tax receipts for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvements divided equally among Council districts and 65% of the available annual sales tax receipts for capital maintenance, pursuant to Sections 94.500 through 94.550; reaffirming the role of the Public Improvements Advisory Committee; providing for submission of this ordinance to the qualified voters of the City for their approval at a special election called for Tuesday, April 4, 2017; authorizing and directing the City Clerk to notify the responsible election authorities of this election; authorizing and directing the City Clerk to notify the Missouri Director of Revenue if the proposal is approved by the voters; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of 94.500 to 94.550, RSMo., the City Sales Tax Act, the cities of the state are empowered to impose by ordinance, for general purposes, a tax for general revenue purposes on all sellers for the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property or rendering taxable services at retail on the receipts from the sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services at retail within any city adopting such tax, if such property and services are subject to taxation under the provisions of 144.010 to 144.525, RSMo., and Kansas City, Missouri (the "City") desires to avail itself of such authorization; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the City Sales Tax Act., no ordinance enacted pursuant to that authority shall be effective until it has been submitted to the qualified voters of the city and approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Council to fund a basic maintenance and capital improvements program for 20 additional years by the extension of the current 1% general sales tax used for capital improvements and maintenance;
NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. **Enactment of tax.** That a new Section 68-449, Code of Ordinances, entitled Sales tax (2019) is enacted to read as follows:

Sec. 68-449. Sales tax (2019)

(a) *Imposition of sales tax.* Pursuant to the authority granted by and subject to the provisions of section 94.500 through section 94.550, Revised Statutes of Missouri, the City Sales Tax Act, a tax for the benefit of the City is hereby imposed upon all sellers for the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property or rendering taxable services at retail to the extent and in the manner provided in section 144.010 through section 144.525, Revised Statutes of Missouri, and the rules and

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regulations of the director of revenue issued pursuant thereto. The rate of the tax shall be 1% on the receipts from the sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services at retail within the city, if such property and such services are subject to taxation by the state under the provisions of section 144.010 through section 144.525, Revised Statutes of Missouri. The tax shall become effective January 1, 2019, and shall apply to all sales made after December 31, 2018, for a period of twenty years and shall be collected as provided in section 94.500 through section 94.550, Revised Statutes of Missouri.

(b) *Allocation of sales tax.*

(1) *Special program funding - neighborhoods.*

(i) *PIAC recommendations.* For fiscal years beginning May 1, 2019, the Public Improvements Advisory Committee ("PIAC") shall make recommendations regarding 35% of the available sales tax receipts recognized by the City raised through this sales tax for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvements divided equally among Council districts.

(ii) *City Council approval.* For fiscal years beginning May 1, 2019, the City Council's final approval will include the PIAC's recommendations for 35% of the available sales tax receipts recognized by the City raised through this sales tax for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvements divided equally among Council districts.

(2) *Special program funding - capital maintenance.*

(i) *City Manager recommendations.* For fiscal years beginning May 1, 2019, the City Manager, with review and comment by the Public Improvements Advisory Committee, shall make recommendations regarding 65% of the available sales tax receipts recognized by the City raised through this sales tax for capital maintenance.

(ii) *City Council approval.* For fiscal years beginning May 1, 2019, the City Council's final approval will include the City Manager's recommendations for 65% of the available sales tax receipts recognized by the City raised through this sales tax for capital maintenance.

(c) *Maintenance defined.* For purposes of this section the term capital maintenance or maintenance shall be defined as the maintenance of, the equivalent replacement of, or the endowing of maintenance for any public capital asset, including but not limited to streets, bridges, sidewalks, flood control, parks and public buildings.

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(d) *Transfer of funds.*

- (1) *Neighborhoods funds.* The two council members from the affected district may request, in writing to the city manager, the transfer of unencumbered balances, in an amount not to exceed \$500,000.00, of the sales tax receipts apportioned to the district for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvement projects. The city manager shall seek the recommendation of the public improvements advisory committee members from the affected district prior to approval of any request to transfer funds under this subsection.

Section 2. Reaffirmation of Public Improvements Advisory Committee process. The Public Improvement Advisory Committee process for identifying and prioritizing the City's needs for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvements will be followed.

Section 3. Organization of the Public Improvements Advisory Committee. The organization of the Public Improvements Advisory Committee will be as follows:

1. *Chair.* The mayor shall appoint a voting member as chairperson.
2. *Regular members.* The at-large and in-district council member for each district shall each appoint one resident of their district as a regular voting member.
3. *Terms.* All representatives and the chair will serve two year terms and be subject to reappointment.

Current PIAC members shall continue to serve until replaced.

Section 4. Maximum public input in the neighborhood improvements process. The Public Improvements Advisory Committee is directed to provide for maximum public input before finalizing each year's recommendations for neighborhood conservation, maintenance and improvements.

Section 5. Inclusion of five-year Capital Improvements Program in annual budget. That the City Manager is directed to include the five-year Capital Improvements Program in the annual budget.

Section 6. Reaffirmation of MBE/WBE and Workforce policies. The City's MBE/WBE and construction workforce policies will be followed in the use of all capital appropriations.

Section 7. Special election called. A special election is called and shall be held on Tuesday, April 4, 2017, at which election the question of continuing the tax described

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in this ordinance shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City for their consideration, as required by section 94.510, Revised Statutes of Missouri.

Section 8. Ballot title. The ballot title shall be:
